So they go to the camp store and buy a barrel of vodka and two hoses.

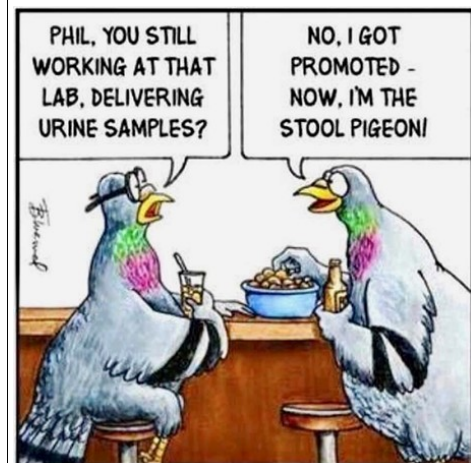
Back in their hut, they open the barrel, stick their hoses in and lie down on their bunks happily sipping away.

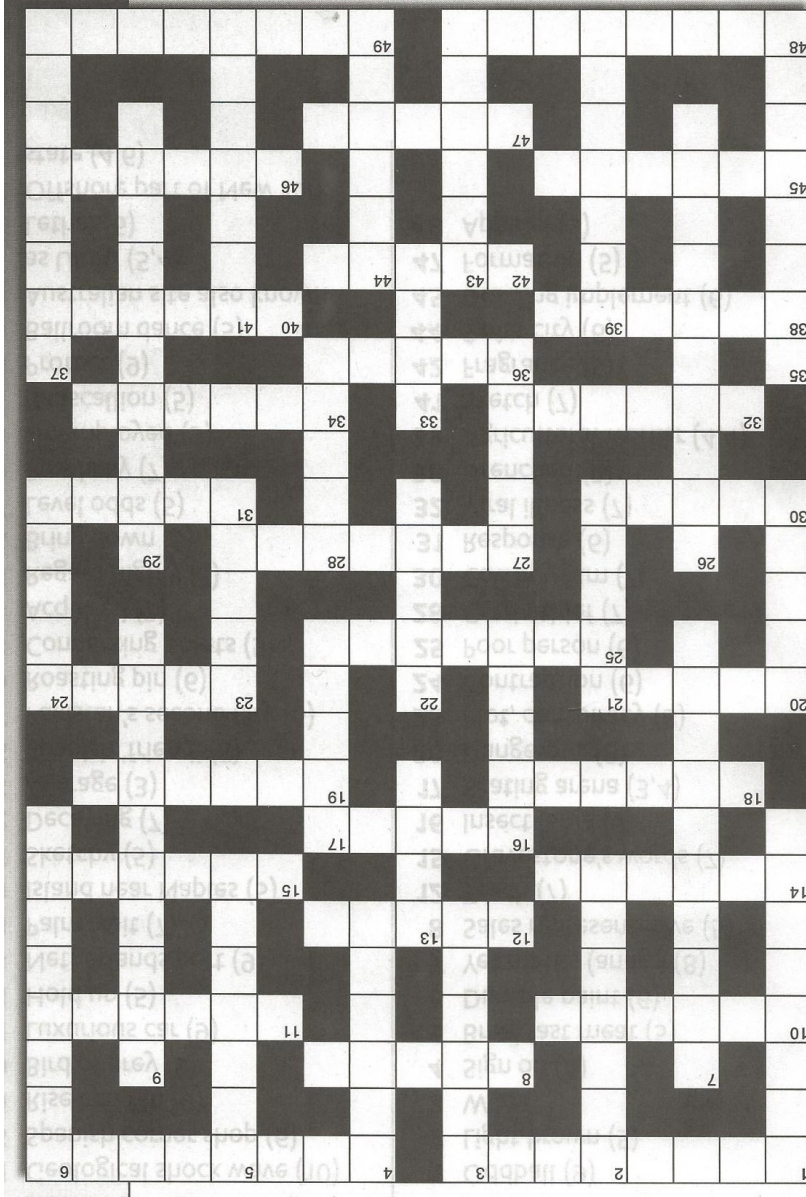
